Assignment #4: Scenarios, Storyboards, & App Map

Scenario 1: Meetup Event

James RSVPed to a UX Designers happy hour meet up online. He's super excited to go and meet other UX designers in San Francisco. James arrives at Churchill Bar at 8pm by himself not knowing anyone. Since it's a bar meet up, nobody has name tags and he can't even tell who is there for the meet up or who is there just hanging out on their own accord.

He pulls out What The Bump and checks into the UX Designers Happy Hour Event and sees there are already 26 members checked-in. Doing a quick scan of the bar he sees another guy by himself who's on the list as well. James goes over and introduces himself as another UX designer also there for the happy hour meet up.

The two of them Bump via What The Bump and find out that they both love Taylor Swift and Sushi (and of course UX Design). A friendship and business partnership follows.

Scenario 2: Conference

Alex is set on making it big in the financial investment world. He attends most the relevant conferences in his city and travels to bigger ones when he can. One way Alex is able to leverage these conferences is by meeting people with similar professional interests to his own, but its not always easy. When he traveled for a 3 day conference in New York, Alex felt a little out of place. He wasn't familiar with some of the speakers and didn't know any of the attendees. He noticed a note on the agenda that recommended a mobile app that helps people connect, its called "What the bump!". He decides to try it out and quickly downloads it on his iPhone. The setup process takes five minutes since it pulls his basic information from his Linked in account. He decides to take it a little further and answers 10 additional questions while he's waiting in line for coffee.

She also knows from chatting with Irene that some of Irene's friends and family live in Washington, DC, where Liz lives and some are also working for public policy or non-profit groups, just like Liz. Liz would love to figure out which of Irene's friends live near her or work in similar fields so that they can chat and get to know each other. She's hoping that some of them might be cool and that they could keep in touch after the

wedding. After all, Irene is a great person and generally has awesome friends. In the past, some of the people that Irene has been friends with have become Liz's good friends too.

On Irene's wedding website, Irene and her fiancé had posted a link to the What the Bump app, and asked their friends and family to download that app and use it to get to know each other at the wedding. His commute to work is 35 minutes and while he checks his email on the BART, he also likes answering questions on "What the bump". He pulls out his phone and is on it pretty much the entire commute. When he opens the app, it gives him an option to "bump" or interact with people, or just "answer questions". Once he clicks the "answer questions" button, he's taken to a screen that does just that, gives him a question-- he can skip or answer it. He answers questions to his heart's content.

Scenario: A Networking Event



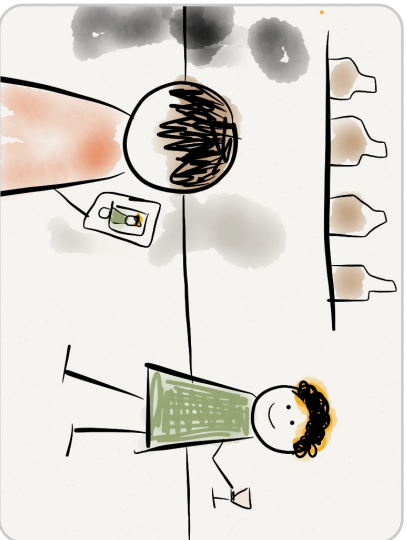

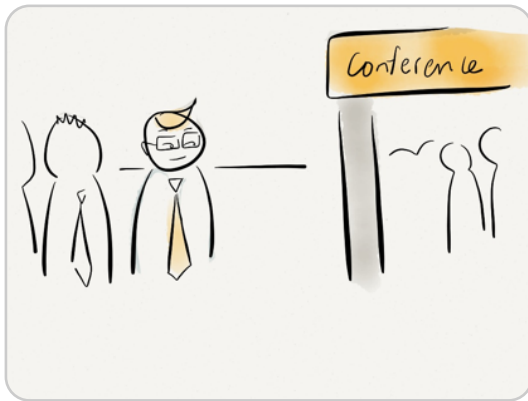

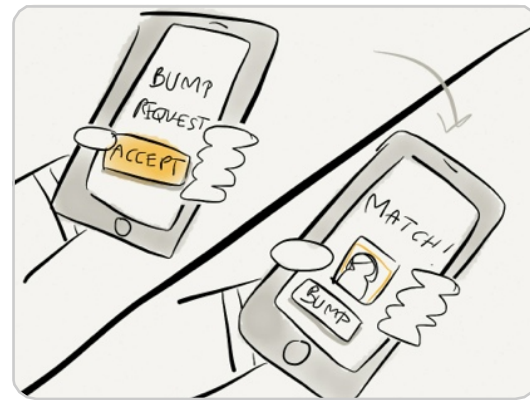
Shot 1: Alex going to a conference



Shot 2: Checking the agenda. Decides to download the app.



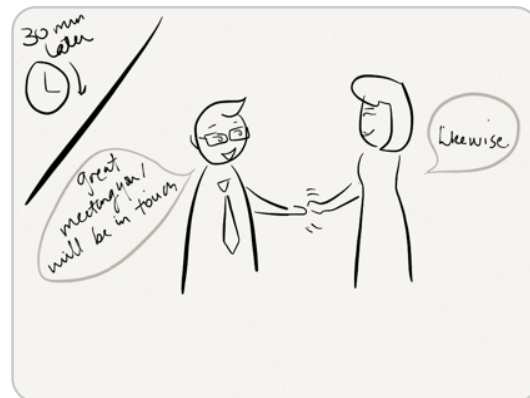
Shot 3: Alex is early, he does not know any of the attendees. His phone rings.

Scenario: At a Wedding



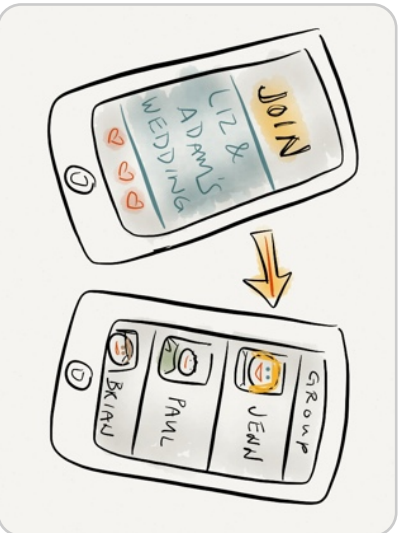
Liz and Adam are getting married. On their wedding website, they invite their guests to use What the Bump to help people meet each other

Liz and Jenn discover that they both live near each other in Washington, DC and that they both love spinning. They make plans to meet after the wedding.

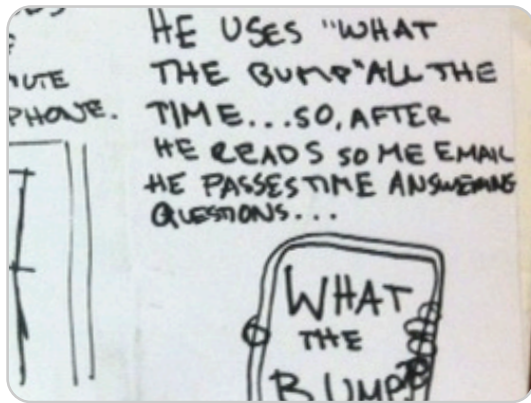

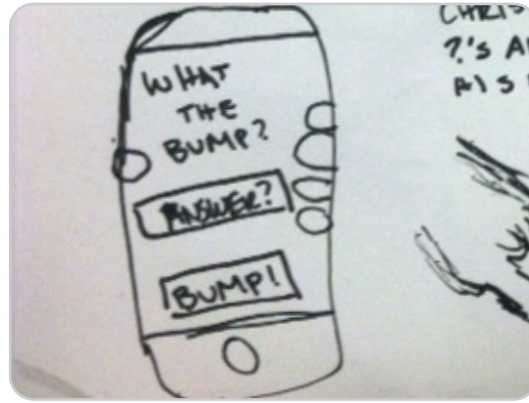
Shot 1: Chris is on his way to work



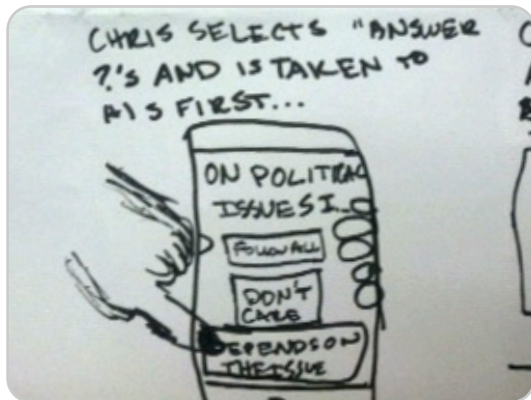
Shot 2: He spends all of his commute on his phone
